## "the "core" classes you need"

- No matter what your path is you will need:
$>4$ years of English
$>4$ years of Social Studies
> 3 years of Science - may take more
- 3 years of Math - may take more
- Phys Ed - 1 semester each year - 2 credits
> $1 / 2$ credit of Health ( $10^{\text {th }}$ grade)
- $1 / 2$ credit Digital Awareness Grade 9


## The Process

- Your teachers will recommend your core classes (e.g., English, Social Science, Math, Science)
- These courses will be input by the teacher through their gradebook.
- Upper level science and math electives may need to be entered manually.
- Some electives (like Languages Levels 2-4) should have a feacher recommendation; most electives do not require teacher sign off.
- When you pick your electives, make sure you meet the prerequisites.
- Fill your schedule. IF YOU ARE HERE ALL DAY AT LEAST 7 CREDITS!
- Choose classes that interest you, meet your needs, prepare you for college!


## The Process

- Most core subjects input by teachers. AP sciences should be written in and scheduled in computer.
- Administratively, we will work on building and creating schedules through out the spring.
- If you have questions or think something should change falk with your counselor and teachers!
- Students should have tentative schedule prior to close of school.


## What is a credit?

1 CREDIT IS AWARDED FOR A COURSE THAT MEEIS EVERYDAY FOR THE WHOLE YEAR<br>$1 ⁄ 2$ CREDIT IS AWARDED FOR A COURSE THAT MEETS EVERYDAY FOR A SEMESTER

## The number of credits taken per year:

8 credits = no study halls plus lunch
7 credits $=1$ period of study hall

## GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Class of 2022 and beyond
Purpose:
It shall be the policy of the board to acknowledge each student's successful completion of the instructional program appropriate to the student's interests and needs by the awarding of a diploma or certificate at fitting graduation ceremonies.

Authority:
The board shall award a regular high school diploma to every student enrolled in the district who meets the requirements of graduation established by this board.

Twenty Five (25) units of credit in grades $9,10,11$, and 12 shall be required for graduation for all students and shall include the following:

- Four units of English credit
- Four units of social studies
- Three units of mathematics
- Three units of science
- Students may select additional credits of English, Social Studies, Math or Science.
- Physical education shall be taken at least one semester in each grade ( $9,10,11$, and 12 ) at . 5 credits per semester.
- Health education: Grade 10 (. 5 credits)
- Digital Awareness: A course addressing understanding the need to create a positive digital footprint and the appropriate use of technology. Grade 9 (.5 Credits)
- Electives shall make up the additional necessary units.
- A student may select elective units from other subject offerings, including approved vocation education courses. However, he or she should make sure that his or her choice will contribute to his or her preparation for employment or for admission to college, as well as satisfaction of personal and cultural needs and the required twenty five credits for graduation.
- All students must register for at least seven credits including Physical Education per academic year. The building principal must approve any deviation from this requirement.
- Students must meet any Pennsylvania Department of Education required demonstrations of Proficiency.
