magine paying up to \$75 a month for dirt-brown tainted water. Water you drink, wash your dishes in, and brush your teeth with. In Aliquippa, residents face almost weekly struggles when after every storm they turn on the sink to find a grimey unappealing fluid.

So your water is brown. Why is this happening? The discoloration of the water is the result of it being mixed with minerals and things such as iron and manganese. When the iron mixes with the chlorine in the water (used to clean it) this makes the water turn brown. As for the sediment and dirt that is visible from time to time, this can be chalked up to water line breaks.

Kaidyn Plopi, an employee from a Wendy's located in Aliquippa, can recall multiple occasions when staff had to deal with dirty unusable water. "We had this one day that the water was really bad. Not only was it brown, but there was a notice out that we couldn't use it, so we couldn't make lemonade and we

couldn't use pop machines." As a fast food restaurant, serving beverages along with food is standard. It's also something less inclined to happen when the water is contaminated.

For those of you thinking, "Okay, so the water is a little brown, so what?"

Well, while the idea of showering in brown water may not bother you, there are also side effects from using grubby water all the time. Washing your face with water like this is terrible for your skin. Essentially, you are just rubbing additional dirt and sediment into your skin. The same can be said for the shower. When consuming the water, if it is especially bad, you can suffer from unpleasant stomach problems.

In finding a solution to the problem, people have spoken out. Some have even voiced their outrage by creating a facebook page called "Aliquippa's Water Issues". The group has over 600 members, and they feel very passionately about the problem. The page states, "It seemed

As for the water authorities, they've asked everyone to remain patient to the problem. Replacing water lines is a process; it takes time and it takes money. For the residents of Aliquippa, however, with their already thinning patience it may be hard to view the glass as half full.

The Arc of Scythe Trilogy is a young adult novel written by Neil Shusterman. A world where no one can die and everything is at peace. The only thing that can kill you is a Scythe. The story takes place in a world where everyone is treated equally apart from the Scythes who are higher than any being on earth. Citra and Rowan however find this perfect world they live in, isn't so peaceful at all.

The story takes place as soon as the characters are introduced. Citra and Rowan each encounter a Scythe in different circumstances never actually having one in their lives. Soon after, they become apprentices where they now have to learn the *Art of Killing* or, for a more humane verb, "Gleaning." As these stories go, a distinctive amount have some pro's and con's.

CONS

*The world is better explained in the second book *Thunderhead* but still leaves a few unanswered questions. Two years have passed between the books. In the first book you're told of the "Thunderhead", an entity that's almost god like. But even in the second book when he gets a chance to speak, you still have no idea what it actually is, where did it come from, and why is it only technology based but still has its own mind? It leaves more relgious readers left with questions.

*"Scythe," the first book, introduces an almost cultist-like group called "Tonist". Most readers complained that the idea of Tonist wasn't exactly explained and had no purpose in the story line. The only thing you get is they don't like the idea of immortality, and do extreme things to achieve their goal of mortality. They also "pray" to the great Tuning Fork and hang it everywhere like a cross. In most cases it's useless, but it could serve as people filling in prayer to an entity that might not exist.

*A more personal matter that some of the readers notice when they pick up the book. The Genre

where the book was placed was at "Young Adult Love" meaning there was more romance in the book then anything. Further reading in the series there's more action than anything. Even in the one scene where love came across, it seemed awkward and lasted only a paragraph almost like Neil didn't want to write it. It's the same with the second book. The romance lasts a paragraph and goes right back to the action. The genre should be more "Adventure and Action" then "Young Adult Love." But maybe Neil has something in mind for the third book.

PROS

*In every chapter in the first book, there is a journal entry they call their "Gleaning Journal", something all scythes must have and write every day. It gives background and feelings to those who don't have much emotion or refuse to show it due to their persona. It's a method to make you feel empathy towards them for their job they didn't choose to have.

*The action is very forward and only last a few paragraphs. When two characters are in a fight, it's very clear on who's throwing the punches and wielding a sword. You know what's happening and who's winning without all the details of every cut and bruise. There's also moments where Neil makes it purposely spine chilling where the reader can't put the book down because they have to see what happens next!

*All the books are told in third person meaning you're not really inside the characters mind, but the fears and tensions of a character are still there when something is happening. Neil doesn't need to explain their emotions. Just reading their movements makes the reader feel for them. Almost like the reader is the book! Another pro on this fact is that random characters appear out of nowhere. You're given little background on how they might be feeling, then all of a sudden action, and or maybe death to someone you just met. It's a personal message to prepare the reader for the real world.

Overall, the books come with great care and love as all books should be. Everything has a downside, even really good books. But sometimes the author, such as Neil Shusterman, makes those mysteries for a reason. After all, there is one more book that just came out on November 5th called "The Toll" which is supposed to be the conclusion of the series. Many readers were jumping with joy and ripping them off the shelves. He's created other books such as "Unwind", "Challenger Deep", "Unwholly", "Everlost" and many more. The style of his writing is very deep and brings all teenagers looking to escape the real world.
